Fast-forward a couple of decades, and there's still something wonderfully appealing about packing up and heading off for a getaway where days are filled with fun activities. What's slightly less appealing? Nights spent crammed into uncomfortable bunk beds. Luckily, there are plenty of luxe getaways that offer all the perks of a camp experience, but with a few grown-up upgrades (read: comfy beds and a glass or two of wine). Oh, and if you're not into hiking or crafting, there are options for you, too. Here, the nine best places to channel your inner camper, whatever your interests.



Coffee Camp

Finca Rosa Blanca, Heredia, Costa Rica

Located on a stunning organic sustainable coffee plantation less than an hour from the San José airport, Finca Rosa Blanca offers guests the opportunity to experience the coffee-making process firsthand. During the harvest seasons, visitors are invited to help pick the coffee berries. They are then taken through the process of cleaning, drying, and roasting the coffee before taking a tour of the packing house. They can also learn how to discern and rate gourmet coffee with an expert guide. Sign up for the four-day culinary adventure package and you'll get to experience herb, pepper, vanilla, and chocolate cultivation and production as well (and taste-test all of it, too!).

Art History Camp

Domaine de Manville, Les Baux de Provence, France

Visiting a Van Gogh in the museum is one thing, touring the sites that inspired some of the artist's most famous works is another entirely. Guests at this gorgeous countryside retreat can sign up for a tour of the Van Gogh trail, which includes the spots where he painted *Starry Night* and *Wheat Fields* series, and then visit the "Van Gogh in Provence: Modernizing Tradition" exhibition at the **Fondation Vincent van Gogh** in Arles, on view through September 11. If, after all that art education, you feel inspired to create a work or two of your own, it wouldn't be tough to convince the hotel to procure an easel and some paints.

Sailing Camp

Casa Madrona Hotel & Spa, Sausalito, California

A newly renovated addition to the San Francisco Bay Area, this renovated historic mansion hotel just launched its Transformative Series program, which allows guests to pick from a number of different skills and hobbies they'd like to learn during their stay. You'll also get morning and afternoon tea and daily lunch at the cooking school.

Art and Design Camp

El Cosmico, Marfa, Texas

Start with the fact that El Cosmico offers accommodations in a range of trailers, yurts, teepees, and tents strewn around its desert property, and it's already starting to sound a lot like camp. Add to that the fact that pretty much any night of the year you're likely to find a communal bonfire or a concert or a cooking class happening on-site, and you start to get the picture. And then, of course, there's all the art to be seen (El Cosmico can help hook you up with tours of the Chinati Foundation, Judd Foundation, and more). However, stay at the property June 22 to 26 and you'll have the chance to participate in a special multi-day workshop called Camp Design Build Adventure, in which participants will learn design, materials sourcing, and construction techniques and work together to build a structure for the Marfa community. Consider it an elevated take on your typical camp-style arts and crafts.

Outdoor Activities Camp

Dunton River Camp, Cresto Ranch, Colorado

The glamping outpost of the famed **Dunton Hot Spring Resort**, Dunton River Camp offers all the perks of a typical summer camp (sleeping in tents, every outdoor activity you could imagine) but with Wi-Fi, high-thread-count sheets, and en suite bathrooms.
